What is it about?

A two-day training to help girls increase their knowledge and leadership skills in order to make positive changes in their community and perhaps run for public office.

Who can participate?

The training is designed for girls in 7th and 8th grade. We have room for 18 girls.

When is it?

The training will be held on two Saturdays in a row—September 11 and September 18. It will last all day, both days, from 9 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The training will be held at the YWCA, 525 N Bonita (just west of I10 between Congress and St Mary's). Girls must arrange their own transportation and be able to participate all day both days in order to sign up.

What will I get out of it?

The training will be fun and interactive. You will learn

- The importance of women leaders now and in the past
- What makes a good leader
- How to get others to care about and support your issues
- Negotiation and conflict resolution skills and the uses of power
- What “politics” is really all about
- What you need to know to run for public office—and why you'd want to
- How to put together a great public presentation
- Ways you can make a difference at your school or in your organization right away

There is no cost for this training. You will get lunch each training day as well as an incentive reward of \$50 for your active participation in all 14 hours of training.
